# 9 EDWARD IV. (1469)

### **MEMBRANE 19.**

March 4. Westminster Grant to the king's mother Cecily, duchess of York, in lieu of a grant to her by letters patent dated 1 June, 1 Edward IV. of the manor of Fodrynghay, co. Northampton, all her estate in which she has surrendered to the king by her letters patent dated 8 February last, of the castle, manor, lordship and honor of Berkhamstede, the borough of Berkhamstede and the manor and lordship of Chilternelangeley *alias* Kyngeslangley, co. Hertford, to hold for life from Michaelmas last with knights fees, advowsons, wards, marriages, reliefs, escheats, views of frank-pledge, courts leet, woods, parks, warrens, chaces, stews, fisheries, fairs, markets, liberties, franchises, customs and other appurtenances. If she be removed in any way from the same she shall be fully recompensed; and the king acquits her of all annuities and other charges on the same, with a reservation in favour of John Pylkyngton, esquire, constable of the castle of Berkhamstede and parker of the park there.

February 9. *Inspeximus* and confirmation to the king's mother Cecily, duchess of York, of Westminster the following:—

- 1. Letters patent dated 1 June, 1 Edward IV, granting to her for life divers manors, lands and rents in recompense of her jointure.
- 2. Letters patent dated 4 March, 9 Edward IV, granting to her for life the castle, manor, lordship, honour and borough of Berkhamstede and the manor and lordship of Chilternlangley *alias* Kyngeslangley, co. Hertford.
